
Pattern Made by Sara Flynn

This quilt design is offered as a design from the Portland Modern Block Study design project, where we showcase members of the Portland Modern Quilt Guild.


Our mission is to support, empower and encourage the growth of members within the world of modern quilting and beyond. We hope to accomplish this mission by creating a modern quilt study program that holds space for members in our community to develop skills, showcase talents and explore opportunities.

Materials

Yardage is based on 42" width fabric

- Umber 1 3/8 yard
- Cornhusk 2 3/8 yard
- Mauve 1 ¾ yard
- Deep Denim 1 yard
- Bright Sky Blue 1 ¼ yard
- Baby Blue light ¼ yard

Preparation Block One



- 1. Print the templates for block 1
 - Print at 100%
- 2. There are a total of 8 blocks made in the block 1 design.
- 3. Template C cuts WOF at 4 5/8"
 - Denim 32 squares
 - 2 strips WOF

- Subcut into 32 squares using the template as a guide
- Bright Blue 32 squares
 - 2 strips WOF
 - Subcut into 32 squares using the template as a guide
- Light Blue 8 squares
 - 1 strip WOF
 - Subcut into 8 squares using the template as a guide
- Mauve 32 squares
 - 2 strips WOF
 - Subcut into 32 squares using the template as a guide
- 4. Template A cuts at WOF at 3 ½"
 - Burnt Umber 32 triangles
 - 2 strips WOF
- 5. Template C cuts at WOF at 4 3/4"
 - Cornhusk 48 triangles
 - 4 strips WOF



Sewing of Block One

This block can be sewn together many ways, here is how I chose to do it.


1. Sewing the corner first and the middle blocks separate, then attaching the four corners to the middle block.





- 6. Finger press while sewing and iron after the block is completed.
- 7. Trim block to 18" square.

Construction of Cat's Eye



- 1. There are a total of 8 blocks in this design to make the quilt as shown.
 - a. There are two options offered to make this block; paper piecing or template piecing.
 - b. This block is broken into 4 quadrants for construction and assembly.


Traditional template piecing option:

- 2. Looking at the block key included with the template pattern, cut the Mauve and Umber strips at 2" wide by 18.5" long, listed as template piece 32 strips of each color are needed.
- 3. Cornhusk fabric listed as; C in the block key.
 - a. 32 pieces of template C, flipping as needed if using prints
- 4. Bright blue fabric listed as B in the block key.

- a. 32 pieces of template B, flipping as needed if using prints
- 5. Deep Blue fabric listed as A in the block kev.
 - a. 32 pieces of template A, flipping as needed if using prints
- 6. Construction: Sew piece C to Piece B, then sew to the dark blue piece A. Construct 4 rectangles in this way, then sew them together using the block key as a reference, adding the two strips on either end, top and bottom. Trim to 18" square and press.


Paper piecing option, cuts and prep

1. Print the paper piecing templates at 100%, tape together using an easy to tear tape. I like to use washi tape.



2. Cut the top and bottom strips of Mauve and Umber at 2.5" x 10", a total of 32 for each color.

3. Cornhusk fabric cut 16 rectangles at 10" x 10", then cut each diagonally in prep for paper piecing to make 32 total.



4. Bright blue, outer eye fabric cut 16 rectangles at 10" x 10", then cut each diagonally in prep for paper piecing to make 32 total.



5. Deep blue, inner eye fabric, cut 32 rectangles sized 3.5" x 10".

6. Paper piece the four quadrants of this block, then sew the two sides together and then together again with the other 2 sides to make an 18" block.








7. Quilt top construction

- a. There are two ways people like to construct this quilt once the blocks are made; by row, or by four blocks at a time. Here is a diagram to illustrate the row method.
- b. Construct the rows, then add the border fabric one color at a time. Border fabrics are cut at 3" wide and these lengths:
 - i. Inner border 3" wide by 6 wof strips
 - ii. Middle border 3" wide by 6 wof strips
 - iii. Outer border 3" wide by 7 wof strips

I like to sew the two side strips, then add the top and bottom borders, one color at a time.





Desert Queen coloring page


